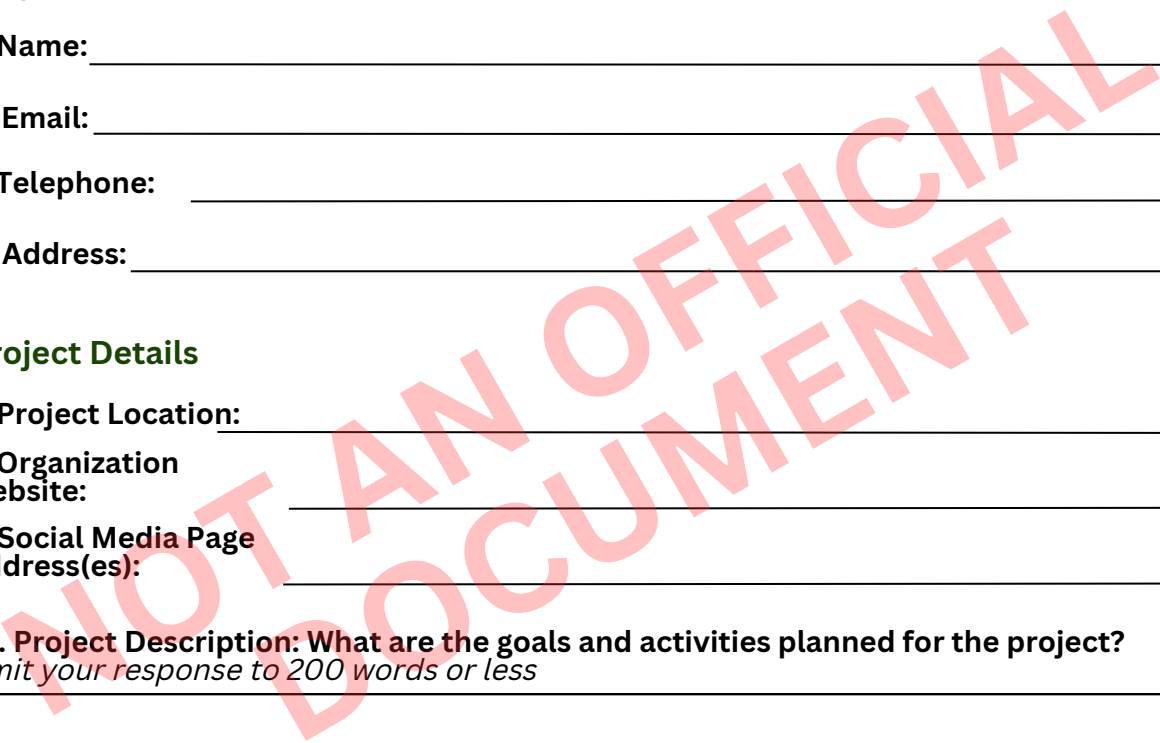

In order to be eligible for consideration for a Seed Grant, a project must be reviewed by a Lisle Mentor. The mentor is a Lisle member who is familiar with the mission, goals and history of Lisle, and who can help assure the project is aligned with Lisle's values and vision. Lisle mentors guide applicants through the grant making process once their Request to Apply is approved. The mentor helps an applicant evaluate a project idea to consider whether it is a good fit for the Lisle Seed Grant Program, and whether an application is appropriate. He or she is the primary point of contact during the application process and is available to respond to questions or concerns raised by the applicant. Many applicants do not have a Lisle mentor when they apply. If the Request to Apply is approved, we will match the applicant with a Lisle Mentor.
